Report To Glemsford Parish Council For PCM 13/11/12

This report covers the period from **06/10/12** to **11/11/12**. During this time there has been 9 crimes recorded within the parish, this compares to **4** crimes for the same period last year.

BREAKDOWN OF CRIME

#Burglary Other Building

- On the night of 12/10/12 a burglary other building took place. No publicity requested therefore no further information available. SU/12/2150 Pc 1635 Moore
- Between the dates of 14/10/12 to 16/10/12 suspects unknown have broken into a garage on Angel Lane and items were stolen. This crime has since been finalised. SU/12/2182 Pcco 3231Partington
- On the night of 25/10/12 suspects unknown have broken into a garage in Lower Road. This crime has since been finalised. SU/12/2256 Pcco 3226 Fudge

#Vehicle crime

- On 02/11/12 at 1830 suspects unknown have attempted to steel items from a vehicle. Although nothing stolen, the vehicle was damaged. Suspects were disturbed by the vehicle owner and seen to make off in an old white Volvo. The investigation is still ongoing SU/12/2297 Pc 1531 DeBrito

#Assaults and public order

- On 14/10/12 a disturbance took place at a property on Slades Close whereby a male was arrested for two offences of common assault without injury. The male has since been charged for both. SU/12/2166 & SU/12/2170 CE Proctor

#Theft

- Between the dates of 05/10/12 to 08/10/12 suspects unknown have stolen vehicle batteries from a property in Lion Road. The crime has since been finalised. SU/12/2136 Ps Horton 566
- Between the dates of 17/10/12 to 19/10/12 items were stolen from a front garden to a property in Egremont Street. This crime has since been finalised. SU/12/2201 Pcco 3231 Partington

#Criminal Damage

- On 7/10/12 two windows were smashed at the Silk Mill Factory. Two youths were responsible for the offence and dealt with by means of community resolution. This crime has since been finalised. SU/12/2121 Pc 1549 Steele

Police are urging people to make contact if any suspicious persons or vehicles are seen in the area. A description or registration number can make all the difference.
