



## BABERGH DISTRICT

### Report To Glemsford Parish Council For PCM 10/09/2013

This report covers the period from **13/08/13** to **10/09/13**. During this time there has been **12** crimes recorded within the parish, this compares to **9** crimes for the same period last year.

### BREAKDOWN OF CRIME

#### **#Burglary Other Building**

The parish of Glemsford have sadly been hit over one night with 6 burglary other buildings. It is believed in most cases access to the property has been gained from farmers fields behind. Locks have been cut with tools and items stolen on most crimes from the garden sheds and garages. Most items stolen have been tools, lawn mowers and petrol streamers. All victims were visited by officers. Our scenes of crime unit attended to try and obtain any forensics left at the scene and house to house enquiries were carried out. Four of the 12 crimes have had successful results leading to either arrests of prosecution of some kind. One crime out of the 12 was discovered to have been an innocent pedestrian picking up the pedal cycle believing it was lost leaving the owner believing it had been stolen.

We are working hard to reassure the residents with our increased patrols and crime reduction advice surgeries. We still urge all residents to be aware of any suspicious activity and to please call the Police with any information you may have. This includes any anti – social behaviour taking place.

If you see any suspicious vehicles driving slowly around your area and they seem to be out of place then please try to take down their registration numbers and pass these onto the Police by dialling 101 the non-emergency number, if it is an emergency you are to dial 999.

Please keep your homes and vehicles as secure as possible, make sure all windows and doors are securely locked and if you are going out for the evening, try to leave a light on down stairs and upstairs to give the impression that somebody is home.

Due to the increase in the theft of CATS you can try and protect them by the following means:

CAT Marking is available from Red Star Woodhall Business Park, Sudbury, CO10 1WH Tel 01787 880998 this costs approximately £12.00.

Install a catalytic converter protector. They come in several forms and usually consist of either a cage or a cable that clamps over the catalytic converter to keep it attached to the car under carriage. While not foolproof, the devices do make it more difficult to remove the converter, making thieves more likely to look elsewhere.

Park in well-lit areas at night. Thieves prefer to work in darkness so they won't be seen while crawling under the car to saw the converter off. Street lamps provide a deterrent since they make it more likely the thief will be spotted.
